Mystic and brimming over with legends, Easter Island is a prime destination for tourists from all over the world. The island enjoys a complex history, that extends back in time to the 4th century AD and its archaeological heritage has no equal anywhere in the world. The unique character of its inhabitants and their traditions, the white beaches and their crystal clear water, and the easy, gentle topography attract hundreds of travelers and adventurers each year.

Here you will find satisfying exploration in the hills and mysterious caves, As well as a paradise of undisturbed and confiding sea wildlife. Easter Island is the most remote inhabited location on earth. This small triangle of volcanic rock, in the middle of the Pacific Ocean, has always been the subject of curiosity and speculation. Is this the remnant of a lost continent?
